




ECVO's Speed Mentoring – Mentee Evaluation

On October 28th, 2013, 22 new and emerging leaders in the nonprofit sector gathered to participate in ECVO'S first Speed Mentoring event.

Pairs of mentees spent 10 minutes with senior leaders seeking advice and insight into nonprofit leadership.

Who Participated in Speed Mentoring



- ED < 2 Years of Experience
- ED > 2 Years of Experience
- Senior Manager
- Emerging Leader

Expectations were met!

Mentees compared their expectations of the Speed Mentoring Event met with their actual experience.

Networking

63% of mentees expected to expand their professional network by participating in the event.

55% of mentees agreed or agreed strongly that their expectation had been met.

Mentoring Relationship

52% of mentees indicated stongly that they expected to develop a mentoring relationship with a senior ED. 27% had a low expectation of this as an outcome of the event.

27% agreed or strongly agreed that their expectations had been met. 34% disagreed or strongly disagreed that their expectations were met.

Meeting Senior Leaders

88% of the mentees agreed or agreed strongly that they expected to meet ED's who they would not have otherwise been able to meet.

88% agreed or agreed strongly that those expectations had been met.

Following Up with Contacts

78% of mentees agreed or strongly agreed that they would want to follow up with contacts made at the event.

78% agreed or strongly agreed that this expectation had been met.

Mentees Were Satisfied

17 of 18 mentees were satisfied with the number of contacts they made at the Speed Mentoring Event. 1 did not know.

89% of participants believed the venue to be appropriate.

89% felt the event was an appropriate length of time

72% indicated they would attend another Speed Mentoring event, while 22% were neutral

89% would recommend this kind of event to their peers.

68% indicated an interest in participating as a mentee in a formal Mentoring Program.

17 of 18 mentees indicated they were interested in participating in in other leadership networking events.
