Barb Burton

Barb has served on a number of non-profit boards in Edmonton over the last 40 years. Currently, she is the Past President of the Sage Seniors Association and has been on the board since 2009. Previously, she worked as a human resources leader for over 35 years. Her career took her across various industries, including work with the City of Edmonton, EPCOR, ATB Financial, and HBA Services (integrated into Alberta Health Services in 2008).

Barb is currently retired and maintains a consultancy focused primarily on organizational assessments, in addition to several volunteer roles which keep her active and engaged in her community.

Brooks Hanewich

Brooks is a co-founder of MatchWork, an online based tool for service agencies supporting groups who face barriers to employment and currently works at the University of Alberta leading Community Economic Development (CED) projects. He has worked in the social sector for more than ten years focusing on employment services, business development, innovation and social enterprise.

Brooks has an MBA in CED and has explored both broader provincial sector matters and local development. Brooks' current interest is in understanding and addressing systemic barriers to CED, and increasing the profile of the social service sector in Alberta.

Wayne is currently a Board Member of E4C, a non-profit community services organization dedicated to mitigating the problems of poverty in Edmonton.
